General Meeting, July 26, 2023

**The meeting was called to order** at 7:34 PM by Vice President Tom Traub, President Corey Swanson not attending.

**Secretary's Report**: Minutes of the June 28, 2023 General Meeting was read by Secretary Walt Pickut. A motion was made to accept the report with the noted correction, seconded, and unanimously approved.

**Treasurer's Report:** John Anderson presented the balance sheet, which indicated that MKO balance remains positive by \$1428.65, and the restricted fund balance is now \$22,468.92. The solar eclipse restricted fund contains \$12,350.50, and the Stem Camp fund stands at \$7470.54, though additional funds remain to be counted. Without additional discussion being requested from the floor, a motion was made to accept the Treasurer's Report, seconded and unanimously approved.

**Program Committee:** Walter Pickut announced that the August speaker will be Dr. Alexandra Yep, a returning favorite speaker and good friend of the observatory describing her ongoing research on "Cosmic Collisions" on August 16.

**Solar Eclipse Committee:** Tom Traub reported that he had met with the regional EOC Emergency Operations Center to discuss the regional arrangements for the April 8, 2024 total solar eclipse will draw an estimated nearly 260,000 people to Chautauqua County alone 200,000 to Western Pennsylvania.

Reported on the concluded STEM Camp, and extremely successful collaboration between Martz-Kohl Observatory and Falconer Central School. Tom congratulated all who were involved and stated that plans already are under consideration for a repeat program next year.

**Technology Committee:** Tom reported on updates of the main image processing software, renewed license for ACP, and astronomy control program. In/

Tom also announced that we are planning to start a mentorship program for new members to learn more about the observatory and participating in our observation and research projects.
